Assuming you are transferring from another institution with the following courses:

- General education (15 credits in A&L, 15 credits in SS, and 2 courses in MC). If you have not completed all requirements via an associate's degree or otherwise, see section on reverse.
- Math 243
- Equivalent courses for Psychology 201 and 202 (e.g. LCC PSY201-203 sequence is equivalent to PSY 201 and PSY202 at UO)
- Writing 121 and 122/123

^{*}If you want to know precisely what courses in your previous institution transferred to the University of Oregon, please go onto DuckWeb and look at your degree audit. The ones that apply to the major or general education will show up as black to indicate that it does satisfy your degree requirements.

^{*}If you notice a mistake on your transfer work or if a class did not show up, remember to print an unofficial or official transcript of your work at the previous school and go to Oregon Hall to talk to the Registrar. They will analyze the course and determine equivalency. Sometimes they may ask for a course syllabus from the course that you took which didn't transfer into the university.
